





Anne Nicholson is the first and founding President of the Chairs Circle for Gender Equality. Anne has a long history in the gender equality movement, including a term as Chairperson of the PEI Advisory Council on the Status of Women (1993 to 1996.)

It has been an exciting and challenging first year of operations for the Chairs Circle for Gender Equality.

Our small but powerful group of leaders from the women's equality seeking groups has incorporated, met regularly, become a non-profit, set up bank accounts, joined the Community Sector Network and the Voluntary Resource Council, held workshops and launched ourselves into the community.

We also pulled together to submit an application for charitable status with Canada Revenue Agency. Despite forming with charitable purpose, it is a challenging process to apply for and achieve charitable status. We, of course, will not give up easily.

Meanwhile, we are planning events for 2024 and looking at all options open to us if indeed we do not achieve charitable status.

I want to thank my fellow members of the Chairs Circle for Gender Equality for their dedication and optimism. This is a wonderful group to work with and I am proud to have the opportunity to chair in the first year of our organization.

It is an incorporated not-for-profit committed to using education to advance equality and inclusion of people and groups excluded as a result of systemic inequality, in the province of Prince Edward Island.

Chairs Circle members recognized the need for a new organization focused on gender equality and inclusion with the charitable purpose to advance education projects and initiatives in the community, with an intersectional, feminist lens and approach.

The Chairs Circle intends to undertake projects and events that complement and support the work of existing organizations working for equality and inclusion in Prince Edward Island, to advance substantive gender equality for women-identifying, non-binary, and gender minority people.

Our Principles


Our work to support education and educational initiatives in PEI will be built on strong principles, especially these:

- Working across Epekwitk (PEI), the traditional and unceded territory of the Mi'kmaq people, with a commitment to reconciliation, peace, and friendship.
- Advancing inclusion of people and groups excluded as a result of systemic inequality.
- Working for gender equality, including women-identifying, non-binary, and gender minority people in PEI.
- Aiming to counter and eliminate activities that are sexist, homophobic, racist, encourage religious intolerance, or that may discriminate against human rights.
- Applying models of asset-based community development, in the belief that communities can create local social change and economic development themselves by identifying and mobilizing existing, but often unrecognized, assets.

PEI 150 Project



Building on October's national celebration of Women's History Month, the PEI 150: Women Making History events welcomed locals and visitors to two dynamic showcase events to celebrate 150 years of PEI women's contributions to Island culture and history.

A day-long program featured hands-on, participatory workshops on women's history and a public reception that brought to life women's history with entertainment by local performers and interactive displays highlighting exciting provincial history projects.

A gala reception celebrated the inception of the Chairs Circle for Gender Equality, our brand-new equity-education organization that emerges from decades of community work and history.

The activities engaged partners from equity-seeking organizations and participants and, in addition to looking at accomplishments of the past, looked to the future: how to make sure PEI's history includes all genders and more diverse content, advancing equity and inclusion of people and groups excluded as a result of systemic inequality.

Department of Education, “Introducing the Black Women’s History Project.” Presentations provided an overview of the project’s curriculum resources on Black women’s history in PEI. Jason MacNeil from the PEI Museum and Heritage Foundation led participants in a show-and-tell activity with artifacts to accompany the lesson plans. He then led a walk through the historical Bog, with support from Linda Hennessey, a descendant of Black Islanders who worked on the project team.

An afternoon workshop led by Michelle Jay (PEI Advisory Council on the Status of Women) and Sarah Outram (PEI Coalition for Women in Government) focused on “Votes for Women: The Next 100 Years.” The presentation shared educator resources associated with a “Votes for Women | 1922-2022 | Votes pour les femmes” graphic poster created for the 100th anniversary of gender being removed as a barrier to voting in PEI. The poster includes 10 images from 10 decades, painted by Mari Basiletti and JoDee Samuelson. A slideshow and discussion guide for educators add to this poster resource.

Two “pop-up” workshops also took place, on the theme of piecing gender and diversity into the historical record.

The first pop-up was a presentation and display led by the Public Archives and Records Office on how and what to donate to the archives. The second pop-up was a presentation on “Ghost Mothers” by Kari Kruse of the PEI Coalition for Women in Government, looking at historical and present-day trends in photography and family photo albums that may exclude women, especially mothers.

PEI 150: Gala Reception

On October 27, as part of the PEI 150: Women Making History Project, a Gala Reception at the Rotary Auditorium in the Charlottetown Library Learning Centre served as the public launch of the Chairs Circle for Gender Equality.

Chairs Circle founding board member Cathy Rose emceed the event and shared some history behind the Chairs Circle on Gender Equality.

Elder Judy Clark offered ceremony (prayer and song) and gave a very moving presentation linking Mi'kmaq History Month and Women's History Month, closing with a reflection on the role of elders and grandmothers in truth and reconciliation and addressing the epidemic of missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls.


Chairs Circle President Anne Nicholson spoke about the future hopes for the Chairs Circle for Gender Equality and engaged those present in the vision for the future.

The entertainment for the evening featured excerpts from the musical-theatrical production The Bessie Carruthers Study Club about the suffragist movement in PEI and around the world. Accompanied by pianist Stephanie Cole, vocalist Suzanne Campbell brought to life the character of Bessie Carruthers and performed mirthful songs about the gender equality movement of more than 100 years ago.

The event closed with appreciations of the founding members of the Chairs Circle for Gender Equality.



Opportunities for Education




GALA RECEPTION DISPLAYS

Educational displays on PEI history were a feature at the Gala Reception to launch the Chairs Circle for Gender Equality at the Charlottetown Library Learning Centre. These included the PEI Museum and Heritage exhibit created for the centennial of gender being removed as a barrier to voting; a display of resources from the Black Women's History Project from the Department of Education; a display of resources from the "Votes for Women" poster from the PEI Advisory Council on the Status of Women and the PEI Coalition for Women in Government; a historical timeline from the PEI Working Group for a Livable Income; historical information from Women's Network PEI, including copies of the magazine Common Ground; and a display about the Chairs Circle for Gender Equality.



BOOK LAUNCH: UNHISTORIC ACTS

The Chairs Circle for Gender Equality was proud to be included in the program at the book launch of founding member Dianne Porter's book, *Unhistoric Acts: Inside the Women's Movement on Prince Edward Island*, published by Pownal Street Press. 
